ECHNIQUES

A Small Choir of Angels





- Strips of STOCKMAR Modelling Beeswax or Modelling Wax (40 x 100 mm) in the colours white, yellow, light blue, violet
- · Floral wire
- Wooden matches
- · Gold string, gold stars
- · A kitchen knife
- 1- The wings and gown are always made from the same colour. Form Modelling Wax into a roll, seal the seam first with the knife and then smooth over with you warm finger (see St. Nicolaus, step 11).
- 2 Tap one end firmly on a hard surface to create an even standing base. Model the other end into a cone. The figure should have a total height of about 5 cm.







- 3 Cut into the conical end about 2 cm with the knife to make the arms and model them round. Fill the notch that you made with a ball of Modelling Wax (Dia. 2).
- 4- Form a pink oval for the head and imprint a mouth with the wooden match; press the head together slightly so that the mouth becomes oval.
- 5- Decorate the head with gold string. Make a knot at the end of the gold string and press into the back of the head, then coil the string in a spiral around the head, pressing it gently into the Modelling Wax as you work (Dia. 3). Connect the head and body with a piece of wire. Bend the head backwards a bit. Attach gold string to the hemline and a gold star under the neck.
- **6** For the wings, make the Modelling Wax so thin that it becomes transparent. Place Sticking Wax on the ends of the winas and attach to the back.
