## St. Nicolaus and his helpers

#### What you need

- Strips of STOCKMAR Modelling Beeswax or Modelling Wax (40 x 100 mm) in the colours red, white, pink, brown and black
- · A kitchen knife
- · Sticking Wax
- · Floral wire
- · A small branch



#### St. Nick's helpers

St. Nick's little helpers are made in the same way as the "Little Imps" described in Part 3. The only difference is that the beard is attached on the sides of the face so the whole round face remains visible.





1- Shorten the strip of red Modelling Wax by cutting off about 3 cm, warm the larger piece in your hands and then form into a roll (Dia. 1). First smooth over the seam in the roll with a

knife, then smooth over with your warm fingers. Press the roll firmly onto a level surface to spread and widen the hem of the robe (Dia. 2). 2 -For the boots, form two rolls of black Modelling Wax (about 2 cm long), cut off one



end evenly with the knife, bend the other end forward and model the boots. Be sure the soles of the boots are flat and that they can stand well. Use a piece of wire to connect the boots to the robe (Dia. 2).

3- The head consists of a 1.5 cm oval, from which you can directly model the nose. Shape the beard from the white Modelling Wax in such a way so that it leaves the entire round face visible (Dia. 3).

4- For the hat, make a red ball and create a hollow on one side (see directions "Modelling Basic Forms", Dia. 5). Model the other end into a pointed hat and attach to the


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

head. Connect the head and body with a piece of wire (Dia. 4).

5 - The arms are made from two 4 cm long rolls of Modelling Wax. Shape the upper arm wider in the shoulder area and flatten the other end somewhat to look like a glove (Dia. 5). Bend

one arm backwards so that it can hold the heavy sack.

**6** - Shorten the branch to the desired length and wrap the one glove around the upper end (Dia. 6). Shape the sack from the brown Modelling Wax and attach firmly to the back; reinforce additionally with Sticking Wax.



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
